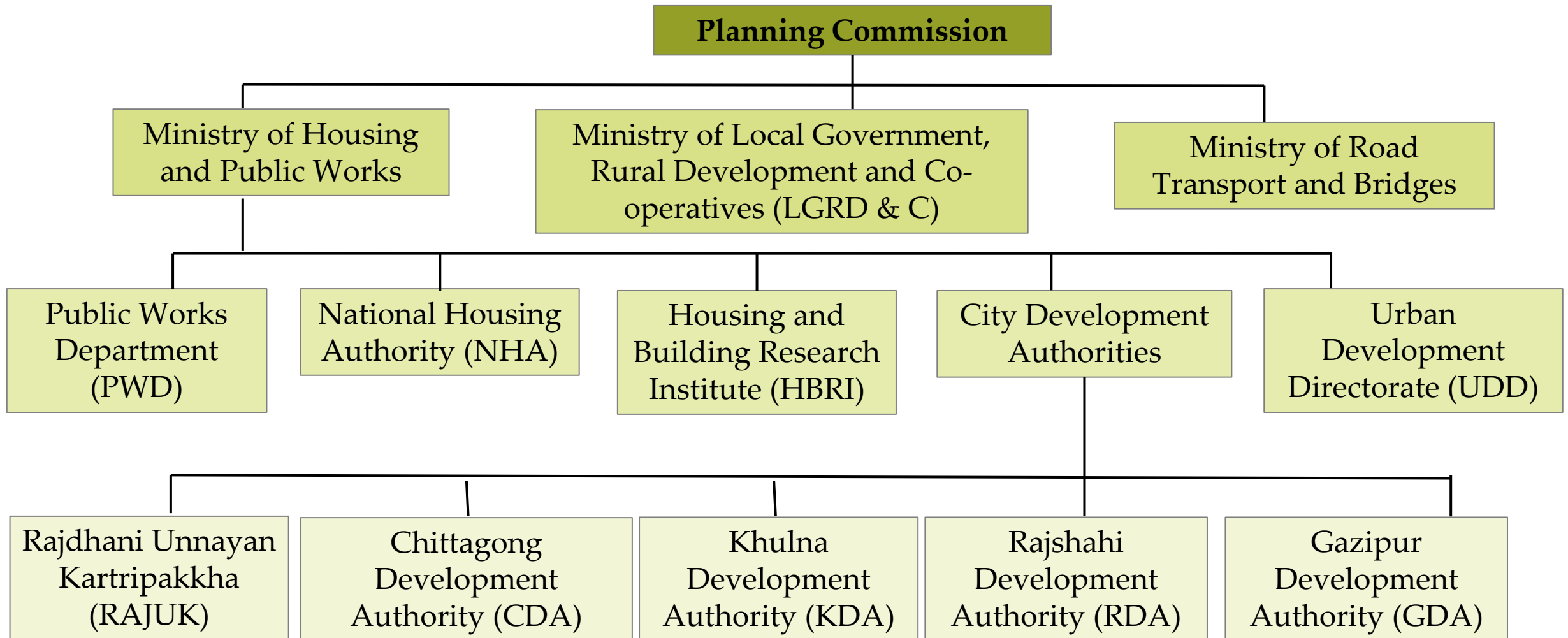

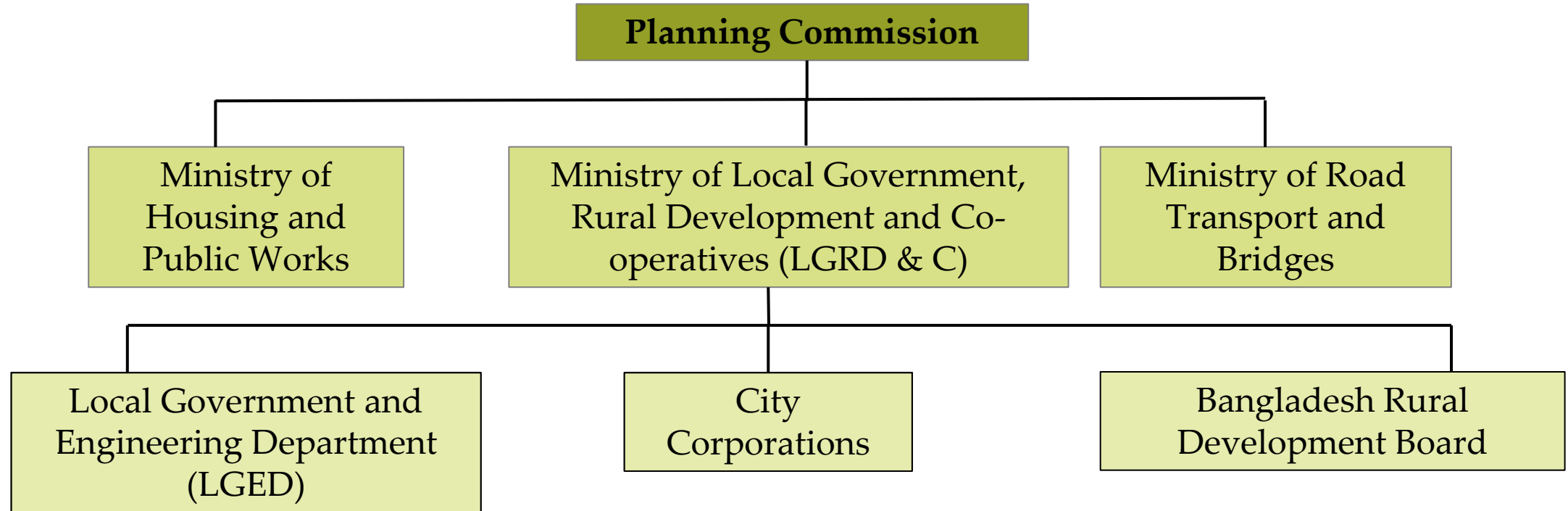
Institutional Framework for Planning

| PWD | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Construction of all types of government office, housing and other infrastructure• Maintenance and Development of Public Parks• Set the standards of infrastructure development |
| NHA | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• NHA is a public sector agency engaged in solving the country's housing problems, particularly for the poor, and low and the middle-income group of people. |
| HBRI | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• HBRI conducts research in housing problems, innovation in construction materials, technology, and planning |
| City Development Authority | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Formulate detailed area plan, master plan and structural plan for areas within the jurisdiction of RAJUK, CDA, KDA, RDA, GDA and COXDA• Mainly involved in planning, development, and development control |
| UDD | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Formulate detailed area plan, master plan and structural plan outside the areas of RAJUK, CDA, KDA, RDA and COXDA |

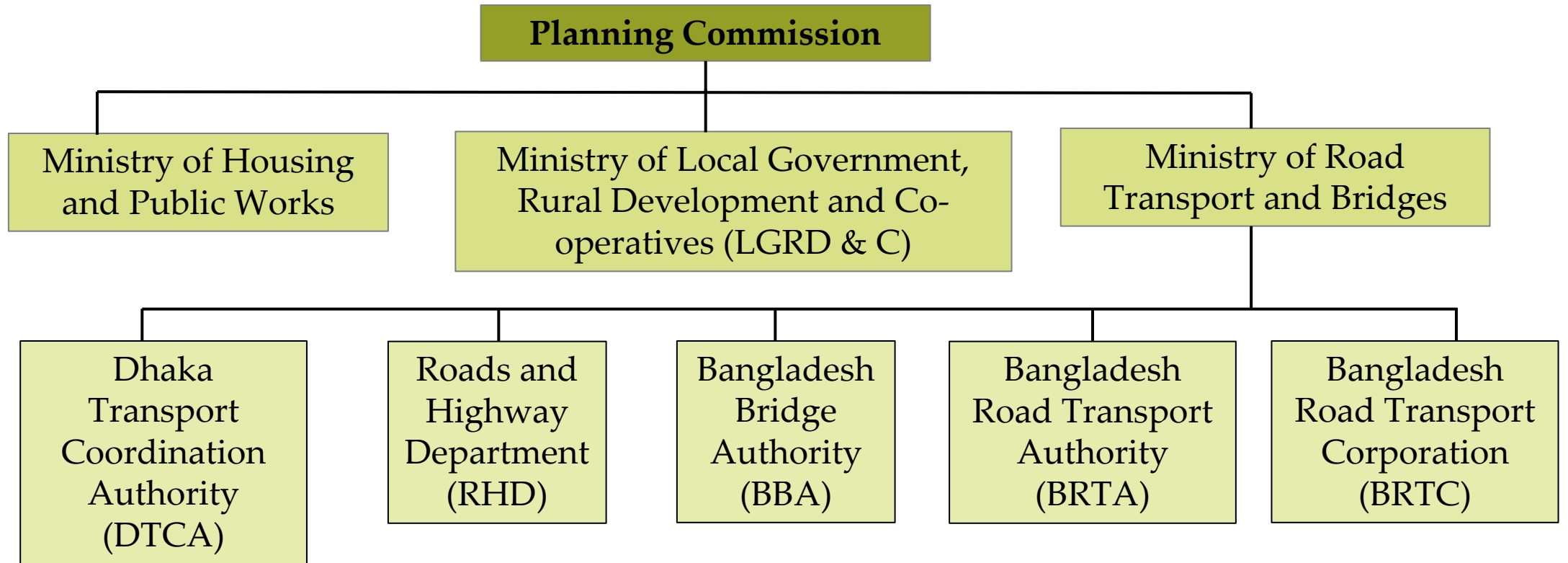

| LGED | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Provision of transport infrastructure in rural areas• Provide technical support to the rural and the urban local government institutions (LGIs) |
| City Corporations | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Provide civic amenities to the citizen• Work for development in their respective areas of jurisdiction• Monitor and oversee educational institutions, health and family welfare service facilities |
| BRDB | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• It is the prime government agency engaged in rural development and poverty alleviation• Organize the small and marginal farmers into co-operative societies for increasing agricultural production |

| DTCA | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Ensure integrated and safe traffic and transportation system for Dhaka• Co-ordinate the traffic and transportation infrastructure development plan with the overall development strategy plan for Dhaka |
| RHD | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Construction and the maintenance of the highways and bridge network of Bangladesh. |
| BBA | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Ensure uninterrupted transport system through building and maintaining bridges, toll roads, tunnels, flyovers, expressways, elevated expressways,, ring roads etc. of 1500 meters and above. |

| BRTA | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• BRTA is a regulatory body to ensure discipline in the road transport sector and road safety related areas in Bangladesh• Executing motor vehicle acts, issuing route permits, and fixing rates and fares of buses and trucks• Conducting regular activities like: Issuing driving licenses, fitness certificates, registration certificates, and driving Instructor's licenses |
| BRTC | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• BRTC operates three international bus lines, inter-district bus services, inter-city bus services in many major cities of the country.• For transportation of cargo, BRTC operates a fleet of 170 trucks and those carry about twenty percent of the government food. |
