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Introduction to Outcome-Based Education (OBE)

- Outcome-Based Education (OBE) is an educational approach focused on achieving specific outcomes in terms of knowledge, skills, and attitudes.
- OBE ensures alignment between learning outcomes, teaching, and assessment.
- Emphasizes what students should be able to do after completing a course or program.

Importance of OBE

OBE helps improve the quality of education by:

- Providing clarity on what is expected from students.
- Aligning teaching methods with intended outcomes.
- Ensuring that assessments measure actual understanding and skill.

Bloom's Taxonomy Overview

- Bloom's Taxonomy classifies learning objectives into cognitive levels, from basic knowledge to complex evaluation.

Six levels of Bloom's Taxonomy:

1. Remembering
2. Understanding
3. Applying
4. Analyzing
5. Creating
6. Evaluating

Cognitive Levels and Example Questions

Examples of questions at each level of Bloom's Taxonomy:

- Remembering: What is an IP address?
- Understanding: Explain how subnetting works.
- Applying: Use subnetting to divide a network.
- Analyzing: Compare IPv4 and IPv6 addressing.
- Creating: Design a network topology for a given scenario.
- Evaluating: Justify the choice of a specific network protocol.

Aligning Bloom's Taxonomy with OBE

How Bloom's Taxonomy supports Outcome-Based Education:

- Helps categorize learning outcomes into levels of complexity.
- Enables structured assessment and evaluation of student progress.
- Supports higher-order thinking skills development.
