

 Articles are words that define a noun as specific or unspecific.






# NOTICE THE DIFFERENCES:

# **TYPES OF ARTICLES**





#### DEFINITE ARTICLES VERSUS

#### **INDEFINITE ARTICLES**

Definite Articles are used to indicate something specific

Can be used after introducing the noun or noun phrase

Can be used with singular and plural nouns

Used to discuss something that is already known by the reader/listener

Used with countable and uncountable nouns Indefinite Articles are used to indicate something nonspecific

Can be used to introduce a noun or noun phrase

Can be used only with singular nouns

Cannot be used to discuss something that is already known by the reader/listener

> Cannot be used with uncountable nouns



### LET'S SEE SOME EXAMPLES

- Give me the pen.
- Give me a pen.
- He was holding a pen, the pen was red.
- A meal for 25 people was cooked by my grandmother, the meal was delicious.
- Where is the story book I gave you yesterday?
- Where can I find a story book for children?
- I have a friend in Toronto.
- I have some friends in Toronto.
- He dived into the water.  $\checkmark$
- He dived into a water.  $\otimes$



# USE OF INDEFINITE ARTICLES

A or An

- Before consonant sound we use A
- Before vowel sound we use An



### **General Examples**

<u>a</u> book <u>a</u> letter <u>a</u> coat <u>a</u> new idea <u>An</u> address <u>an</u> egg <u>an</u> idea <u>an</u> old man








### **Difficult Cases**

- University = you-niversity
- One-eyed = won-eyed







#### When to use?

- He is good.
- He is a good boy.

\* before 'adjective' we don't use articles.
