### Career

Rahman started his career as a trainee in 1966 in his family-owned jute mills in

<u>Chandpur District.</u> He worked as an executive in the mills until 1971.<sup>[3]</sup> Rahman established Transcom Group in 1973<sup>[4]</sup> after W Rahman Jute Mills, the major earning source for the Rahman family, was nationalised in 1972.<sup>[5]</sup> In the 1980s, Rahman became the sole importer and distributor of <u>Nestlé</u> products in Bangladesh. In the 1990s, he bought <u>Smith, Kline & French</u>, a US-based pharmaceutical which had meged into Beecham Group, a British company and renamed it Eskayef.<sup>[6]</sup>

Rahman was elected a member of the executive board of the aris-based International Chamber of Commerce for a three-year term in July 2014. [7]
