Basic Concept of Housing

- In general, housing is often referred to as shelter; but it is more than a shelter.
 It provides an essence of "Home".
- Housing is a shelter, as well as all the facilities such as roads, utilities, and surrounding environment, provided together.
- It is an arranged living place ensuring safety, comfort, and legal right to use.





Housing VS Shelter

- Shelter is a basic commodity that all people need for survival
- Housing assures a person's survival as well as helps them thrive as a human being. It links the family/ individual to the community and environment.

• The variety of housing choices makes it more than a shelter.





Defining Housing

According to World Health Organization (WHO), housing is defined as:

- Enclosed environment where man finds protection and feels secured
- Where people can function with comfort and satisfaction and which provides privacy to the individual/family.
- The environment must include all necessary services, and facilities, needed for the physical and social wellbeing of the family/ individual.























Housing Terminologies

Shelter: A physical facility, unit, or structure, which provides a place for occupants to have <u>protection from natural calamities</u>

House: It is a shelter consisting of walls, floors, doors, windows, roof, etc. in which human beings live (should have a <u>proper</u> <u>structure</u>)

Home: Home is a house in which a <u>family</u> lives and enjoys all the happiness and affection for each other

Dwelling: A dwelling is a <u>residence for</u> someone to live in. It may have a group of rooms or a single room for multiple functions. Dwelling is a broad term used to define a <u>place to live</u>. Houses, apartments, shelters all are dwellings.

Housing: Housing is a colony of houses with all amenities (utilities and community facilities). A housing colony has a profound impact on the socioeconomic and physio-psychological development of human beings



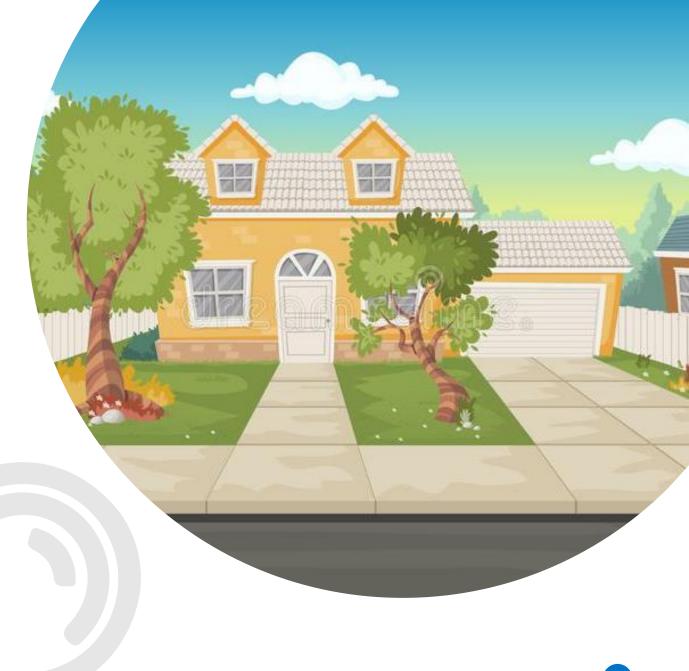
Why Housing is an Unique Commodity

Demand: Constantly growing and elastic

Supply: Scarce and inelastic

Other characteristics:

- High Cost and Durability
- Limited Adaptability
- Fixity (Location)
- Complex and Diverse Housing Stock
- Imposed by Government Regulations
- Externalities/ Exogenous Influence
- Importance to quality of life and self identity





Significance of Housing

- Protects from extreme weather (heat, cold, rain, wind)
- Ensures prerequisite of **good health** such as space, lighting, ventilation, and sanitation.
- Provides security, sense of belonging and sense of privacy to the dweller
- An expression of identity and social status
- Ensures financial security (through sell, rent or mortgage)
- Largest single investment for many families
- Provide a healthy environment to teach personality, attitude, and family values
- Provides a cultural environment to teach customs, traditions, habits, and cultural ways of living
- Housing is a determining factor for assessing the standard of living of a family
- Housing condition is a measure of the nation's progress



Housing Typology

Based on User/ Occupier:

- 1. Family Housing
- 2. Dormitory Housing

Based on Ownership Type:

- 1. Owned
- 2. Rented

Based on Termination of Right:

- 1.Permanent
- 2. Temporary

(ex: government quarter, rehabilitation)

Based on Provider:

- 1. Government Housing (Public Sector)
- 2. Non Government Housing (Private Sector)
 - Personal
 - Cooperative
 - Real Estate Developer



Types of Houses based on Structure

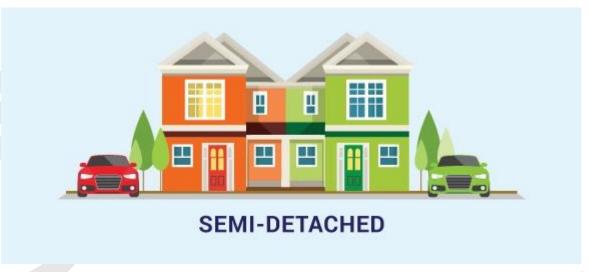
Detached House:

- Surrounded by own land on all sides
- Single family dwelling
- Generally one or two storied building
- Design and construction varies according to choice of owner

Semi-detached House:

- One wall is shared between two houses to reduce the construction cost
- Utility services can also be shared between two families







Types of Houses based on Structure

Apartment House:

- Multi unit house with number of dwelling units located in different storeys
- Each floor may accommodate more than one tenant
- Land and other amenities shared by all occupants
